Dear Parents,

This August newsletter is filled with all of the information you and your student will need to be fully prepared for the start of the 2009-10 school year. Please take the time to read the information thoroughly so you don't miss out on opportunities at the beginning of school or be caught by surprise with something that has changed.

Freshman Parent/New Parent Orientation

This is an opportunity for parents of our newest students to meet administrators and your student's counselor, and to learn about the policies and procedures of LHS.

August 11, 6:30-7:30 pm, End Zone Cafeteria: Parents of 9th graders and new students whose last names begin with A-L.

August 12, 6:30-7:30 pm, End Zone Cafeteria: Parents of 9th graders and new students whose last names begin with M-Z.

Student Schedules

There were a few days in July during which our students' schedules for 2009-10 were viewable on PowerSchool. If your student happened to get a look at his/her schedule at that time, please know the chances of that schedule changing are great. Classes still have to be balanced, new students have to be added and decisions about adding additional sections still have to be made. Student schedules will not be final until we print them for Orientation. Please make sure your student attends Orientation to pick up an official schedule, have a school photo taken, and to receive a new ID Badge.

Again this year, schedule changes will be made in very few and only exceptional circumstances. Our classes are very tight and some class sizes are very large. In many cases students received their alternate choice for a class because of a scheduling conflict, or because more students registered for the class than we are able to provide spaces. It is a regrettable situation, but it is our reality. I hope you will understand if this affects your student.

Back To School Night...commences earlier this year!

Thursday, August 27, 6:30-8:25 pm

This evening will be an opportunity for you to meet your student's teachers, learn what they have planned for the year, how to contact them if you have a question, and how students can get additional help if they find themselves struggling. Be sure to have your student fill out the flyer in this newsletter so you will know which classrooms to visit.

Extra-curricular Code of Conduct...new this year!

Our mission, i.e., the purpose of our institution, is to educate our students to achieve their maximum potential and to prepare them to be responsible citizens. For this reason LHS has had an eligibility policy in place for many years that requires students to have at least a 2.0 GPA, no more than 7 single periods of unexcused absence per quarter, no more than 10 tardies per quarter, and no more than 3 days of suspension per quarter. New this year

is a provision regarding suspensions for a drugs or alcohol related offense. Students who face this type of discipline will immediately lose their eligibility for any extra-curricular activity, including but not limited to, athletics, drama productions, speech and debate, student council, Academic Decathlon and Science Bowl. As for all suspensions lasting four or more days, this period of ineligibility will begin the day they return from their suspension and last for 30 calendar days.

Academic Success Center...new this year!

This new support program will be staffed by teacher Larry White during periods 2, 3 and 4, by teacher Jamie (Reindel) Ward during periods 5, 6 and 7, and by counselor Sabrina Eshaghi all day. The Success Center will operate out of room 1132 and focus on the prevention of failure for 9th grade students. Historically, too many of our freshmen have experienced difficulty making the transition to high school. The realization that every homework assignment matters, that quarter and semester grades are primarily focused on test grades and projects, and that a failing semester grade immediately puts a student at risk for not graduating on time with his/her peers has too often come when it's too late to do anything about it. The Success Center staff will spend considerable energy working to avoid this scenario by catching students before they fall too far behind.

Additionally, students who are suspended for non-violent offenses will be assigned on-campus suspension in the Success Center. We want to be sure these students have a chance to face their consequences in a way that will maximize their opportunity to learn from their mistake, and we want to be sure these students complete the class work they would miss while suspended.

Digital Marquis

Thanks to gifts from the Classes of 2006, 2007 and 2009, we will be installing a digital marquis in place of the current marquis at the entrance to our parking lot before the 2009-10 year ends. This new structure is going to make a strong statement of welcome as students, parents, staff and visitors arrive to our school. Plans for the final design of the marquis are still in process, so if you would like to make a financial contribution towards this project, it's not too late. Make your tax-deductible contribution to Lincoln High School and note "digital marquis" in the memo line.

Dress Code

When shopping for school clothes this summer, please make note of our dress code found on page 13 of this newsletter. Pay particular attention to making sure the length of shorts and skirts for your daughter is mid-thigh and do not fall into the category of "short-shorts". For your son, please buy their pants so they ride on their hips, not on their thighs. Sagging is still not acceptable.


ID Badges

Students will be required to wear their ID badge on a daily basis while on campus again this year. Last year's Average Daily Attendance was 95.11%, exceeding our goal of 95% for the first time in more than 10 years. Locker Information

Locker Registration

Lockers are available on a first come, first served basis to seniors and juniors during orientation. A limited number will be available to sophomores and freshmen. **Students are not required to have a locker and should not register for one if they do not plan to use it.**




Bring a lock with you **during orientation** and put it on the locker you want. Then go to the locker registration area with your **locker registration sheet** (it has a # printed on it). **Any locks placed on unregistered lockers will be cut off.**

Locker Policy

Lockers are available for student convenience only. **The student is fully responsible for the contents and security of the locker** and agrees to provide a suitable lock at his/her own expense, including a replacement if it becomes necessary for the school to remove the lock in case of emergency. A student must register the locker with the assistant director of student activities, and the use of an unregistered locker will not be allowed. Misuse or abuse of the locker will result in cancellation of the student's locker privilege. **Lincoln High School is not responsible for personal or school property that is left in lockers.**

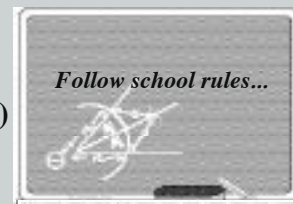

California Scholarship Federation (CSF) Sign-ups Begin August 24, 2009

CSF is a statewide organization to honor outstanding high school students. Applications for semester membership are taken each semester after report cards have been received. Enrollment based on last semester grades will begin on Monday Aug. 24 and end on Friday Sept. 4. Due to a change in the CSF by-laws, late applications can no longer be accepted. To be eligible for membership a student must earn at least 10 points based on the previous semesters grades, and not have any grades lower than a C. A student earns 3 CSF points for an A and 1 CSF point for a B. One additional point shall be granted for a grade of A or B in an AP or Honors course, up to a maximum of two such points per semester. A grade of C does not earn any CSF points and a D or F disqualifies the student from membership for the semester. Of the required 10 CSF points, 7 points must be earned in courses from LISTS I and II, while the remaining 3 points may be earned in courses from any LIST (I, II, or III). Of the 7 points required from LIST I/II courses, at least 4 points must be earned in LIST I courses alone. The exception to this is for seniors applying at the start of their second semester or at graduation, and they may use three courses from LIST II and none from LIST I. A student is limited to a maximum of 5 courses for the computation of CSF eligibility. Students must reapply for membership each semester. To apply for membership, the student needs to bring his/her semester report card and \$5 to Ms. Landucci in room 1510. See Ms. Landucci for a copy of List I, II and III.

Students who are members of CSF for at least 4 out of their last 6 semesters (one of those semester memberships must be earned with senior grades) meet the requirements for Life Membership. The benefits of life membership are the following: receiving the official CSF life membership pin, the Federation chapter seal on their diploma and indication on permanent academic records and transcripts, the Federation chapter seal on the life membership certificate, and a gold tassel and stole to be worn at the graduation ceremony. Girls' Golf



Lincoln Unified School District does not carry medical or dental insurance for your student. For this reason, the district has approved a low cost medical/dental plan for your consideration.

If you're interested in purchasing this insurance, have your student pick up a form during orientation.

Valuable Tips for Parents

California High School Exit Examination

Notice to Parents and Guardians

All students are now required to pass the California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) to receive a high school diploma. This graduation requirement is mandated by state law. Students take the CAHSEE for the first time in the spring of tenth grade.

Purpose of the CAHSEE

The purpose of the CAHSEE is to help improve student achievement and ensure that students who graduate from high school can demonstrate competency in the state content standards for reading, writing, and mathematics. The exam is divided into two parts: (1) English-language arts (reading and writing) and (2) mathematics.

Requirements for Passing the CAHSEE

Students must earn a score of 350 or higher on each part of the CAHSEE (mathematics and English-language arts) in order to pass the exam.

Graduation Requirements

In addition to all Lincoln Unified graduation requirements, students must pass both parts of the CAHSEE to receive their high school diploma.

Testing Dates

The CAHSEE will be given at your school site during regular school hours on the dates specified in the table below. Students who do not pass the exam in tenth grade will have five additional opportunities in grades 11 and 12 to retake the part(s) not passed. Students will receive additional instruction, if needed, to ensure success on this exam.

Student Council Dance Policy

PSAT/NMSQT Wednesday, October 14, 2009 -7:30am

The PSAT/NMSQT is the preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation. Students automatically enter the NMSQT competition when they take the exam during their junior year. Students will receive a detailed score report in January. The score report will give students the correct answers for the questions they answered incorrectly. The score report is very helpful to students who later take the SAT 1.

Sophomores and Juniors wishing to take the PSAT/NMSQT need to register for the exam on Wednesday, Sept.9, 9/16 or 9/30, during lunch or after school in front of the Student Service Center M-Z side. Space is limited so register early!

The test will be given at Lincoln High School on Wednesday, October 14, 2009 at 7:30 a.m. The exam fee is \$14.00. Students may contact Carol Della Maggiora in the Student Service Center for more information.
